New Indian Currency Notes: How New Currency Notes Looks like



After demonetization of high valued notes of ₹500 and ₹1,000 and releasing new ones in November 2016, The Reserve Bank of India has now issued New Indian currency notes of ₹10, ₹50, ₹100, ₹200, ₹500 and ₹2,000 in last 2 years. Earlier in November 2016, The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) introduced new ₹500 and ₹2,000 notes post the demonetization drive by Prime Minister Narendra Modi's government when ₹500 and ₹1,000 notes were banned in a bid to curb black money. The RBI issued the notice to introduce of new ₹50 and ₹200 denomination banknotes in the Mahatma Gandhi (New) Series on August, 2017. After releasing of new ₹50 and ₹200 denomination banknotes, the announcement of the issue of the new ₹10 notes comes in January 2018. All the new notes have distinct designs from the previous Mahatma Gandhi Series of bank notes in terms of colour, size and theme.


